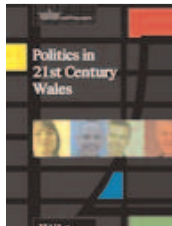
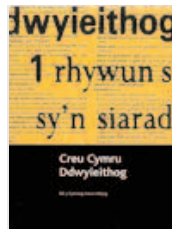

Politics in 21st Century Wales (£10/£7.50 IWA members + £1.50 P&P)

A definitive overview of the future of Welsh politics with contributions from Rhodri Morgan AM, First Minister, Nick Bourne AM leader, Welsh Conservatives, Kirsty Williams, AM Liberal Democrat AM for Brecon and Radnor, and Adam Price, Plaid Cymru MP for Carmarthen East and Dinefwr. The authors address the experience of the May 2007 election and the two months of coalition negotiations that followed, future prospects for coalition.
